### **Most Notable Collaborations**

### Present – 2024 Ag Forecast

Collaborates with other faculty members within the UGA CAES Department of Agricultural & Applied Economics and **UGA Warnell School of Forestry** as well as the **Georgia Department of Agriculture: Georgia Grown** to present the annual Georgia Ag Forecast. The program provides agricultural producers, agribusiness representatives, elected officials, and other agricultural stakeholders a yearly economic outlook of row crops, greenhouse & nursery, forestry, agritourism, pollinators, fruit, vegetable, nut, and production inputs.

**Role:** Presents the Inputs and Production Expenditures presentation and authors the Inputs and Production Expenditures Forecast chapter in the *2024 Georgia Ag Forecast Situation and Outlook Reports* booklet.

**Collaborator's Role:** Present forestry Ag Forecast publications and presentations and answer attendee questions related to forestry outlooks for the upcoming year.

### Present – 2022 **UGA Emergency Preparedness Team**

The UGA Emergency Preparedness Team consists of a diverse group of Extension agents and specialists across Georgia. A few of the team's primary objectives include developing programming for communities to prepare for natural disasters and other emergencies, assisting communities impacted by disasters, and collaborating with other agencies to assess losses after an emergency. UGA Emergency Preparedness Team collaborators include the Local Government Risk Management Services Group, Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency, Extension Disaster Education Network, Fort Valley State University, and USDA Farm Service Agency.

**Role:** Critical roles on the team have included summarizing crop/farm losses after a natural disaster by crop, operating a drone to capture pre-hurricane landfall images of farms and crops, representing UGA Extension at events such as the Georgia Municipal Association Convention & Expo, attending emergency preparedness training events, and working with the team to help host the 2023 Extension Disaster Education Network National Conference in Savannah, GA.

**Collaborator's Role (Local Government Risk Management Services Group):** Provide a platform for Extension educational programming and provide training for Georgia Municipal Association conference attendees.

Collaborator's Role (Extension Disaster Education Network): Preemptively provide disaster education to Extension professionals and serve as a national resource of Extension expertise for other Extension personnel navigating an emergency.

**Collaborator's Role (Fort Valley State University):** Develop programming with the University of Georgia Emergency Preparedness team over disaster preparedness to reach diverse audiences and support post-disaster loss assessments.

Collaborator's Role (USDA Farm Service Agency): Assist agricultural producers in navigating federal disaster relief programs and supporting postdisaster loss assessment efforts.

Collaborator's Role (USDA National Institute of Food and Agriculture): Support UGA Extension Emergency preparedness efforts by providing grant funding for agent training, meeting travel, drones for post-disaster loss assessment, and other programming.

#### 2023 **Turner County Rural Health Farmer Education**

Hosted a rural stress farmer meeting in collaboration with the Georgia Cotton Commission and Turner County Health Department. Meeting participants were invited to have their blood pressure checked by a representative from the local health department and complete an evaluation. Additionally, attendees heard a short presentation from the health department on vaccines, a rural stress management presentation, and an informative presentation from the Georgia Cotton Commission on its efforts to support Georgia cotton farmers. The meeting was attended by 82 people and 53 attendees completed evaluations. Upon completion of the meeting, he provided interested individuals with resources to improve their overall mental and physical health.

**Role:** Responsible for securing funding from the Georgia Cotton Commission to host the meeting, scheduling speakers, and promoting the event to local Extension clientele.

Collaborator's Role (Georgia Cotton Commission): Present a short Georgia Cotton Commission update and provide meeting funding.

Collaborator's Role (Turner County Health Department): Provide blood pressure checks to attendees and present on the vaccines and health programs available at the local health department.

#### 2023 - 2022**UGA Forage Team**

Hancock was formally invited to join the UGA Forage Team in 2022. The UGA Forage Team includes Extension personnel from across the state. Team

members strive to provide livestock producers and other individuals involved in forage production with relevant research-based information and programming to enable them to make optimal management decisions for their operations. UGA Forage Team Collaborators include the **Georgia Cattleman's Association** and the **UGA Department of Crop and Soil Science.** 

**Role:** A few of the team roles included presenting a session in the UGA GrassMasters Program, conducting forage research, authoring blog and magazine articles, and serving on expert panels at meetings such as the Georgia Cattleman's Association meetings.

**Collaborator's Role (Georgia Cattleman's Association):** Promote team's educational programs to members, publish team articles in Georgia Cattleman's Association magazine, and provide a platform for team members to network and share educational materials with cattle producers.

**Collaborator's Role (UGA Department of Crop and Soil Science):** Facilitate team's forage research efforts in collaboration with county Extension agents and support a portion of local educational programming efforts as appropriate, such as the UGA Grassmasters program.

### 2023 – 2019 **Crop Progress and Condition Survey**

The Crop Progress and Condition Survey is a national agricultural reporting platform coordinated by the **USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service**. The survey helps provide federal, state, and local government agencies, educational institutions, and agricultural economists with frequent and timely updates on topics such as weather conditions, crop conditions, and planting and harvest progress.

**Role:** Collect survey information from growers and locally available sources weekly during the growing season and monthly during the winter months. Complete and submit all aspects of the report by the designated deadline each reporting period.

**Collaborator's Role:** Analyze all submitted surveys from across the United States and generate appropriate reports for each reporting period for use by agricultural stakeholders nationwide.

## 2023 - 2019 Floridian Aquifer Collaborative Engagement for Sustainability (FACETS) enterprise crop budgets for NE Florida and SW Georgia

Hancock and collaborators from Auburn University, the University of Florida, Albany State University, and the University of Georgia, united in a regional effort with the FACETS project to promote the economic sustainability of silviculture and agriculture while protecting water quality, quantity, and natural habitat.

**Role:** Validate the accuracy of Georgia and Florida cotton, peanut, forage, and livestock enterprise budgets and run simulations for each state budget to compare net returns per acre in varying management systems and crops.

**Collaborators' Role (Auburn University, University of Florida, Albany State University):** Generate yield data for each management system budget evaluated, gather regional feedback from stakeholders, and coordinate economic simulations and enterprise budget development for each crop.

### 2023 - 2021 UGA Heifer Evaluation and Reproductive (HERD) Team

As a member of the UGA HERD Team, collaborated with the **UGA College of Veterinary Medicine**, **Georgia Cattleman's Association**, and **UGA Department of Animal and Dairy Science** to serve Georgia's beef cattle producers. Based out of two locations in the state, the HERD Team consists of Extension agents and specialists across Georgia who strive to provide cattle producers with current research data about the heifers in their operation. The opportunity for producers to enroll heifers in the program adds value to their animals and enables them to make better decisions related to the genetics of their herd.

**Roles:** Data collection, program and HERD Sale promotion to the public, auction preparation, sale transaction facilitation, and other responsibilities.

**Collaborator's Role (Georgia Cattleman's Association):** Assist with program planning, HERD auction promotion, and provide Georgia Cattleman's Association updates at HERD Team events.

Collaborator's Role (UGA College of Veterinary Medicine and UGA Department of Animal and Dairy Science): Facilitate artificial insemination schedules, manage heifer health issues as they arise, assist in heifer data collection, and perform ultrasound pregnancy checks after breeding.

### 2023 – 2020 Using Pesticides Wisely (UPW) Grower Training(s)

The Using Pesticides Wisely training must be completed yearly by all individuals involved with using Engenia, Tavium, or XtendiMax herbicides or any person in charge of in-season applications of Enlist Duo or Enlist One Enlist cotton or soybean. The purpose of this training is to train those involved with applying the products safely and on-target without drifting the product onto unintended locations. In this collaborative effort with the **Georgia Department of Agriculture: Licensing Division,** he oversaw the training of over 130 cotton producers.

**Role:** Promotion of training to cotton and soybean producers, coordinating training times with growers, presenting training modules in person, and submitting the names of all participants to successfully complete the training to the collaborating partner.

**Collaborator's Role:** Sanction training for growers to satisfy training requirements to use products and record submitted producers who completed training in the state pesticide applicator database.

#### 2022 **Peanut Education**

Collaborated with the Georgia Peanut Commission to educate legislators and other stakeholders about the issues facing Georgia farmers and their efforts to be sustainable. Topics addressed in these meetings included commodity prices, pesticide labeling concerns, and supply-chain issues resulting in delays in receiving necessary repair parts for farm equipment from distributors. In total, this series of educational efforts was attended by 1 U.S. Senator, 20 federal legislative staffers, and 18 social media influencers.

**Role:** At each of the three events, Hancock shared with attendees the efforts being taken by UGA Extension to support Georgia agricultural producers and some of the challenges growers face. Additionally, he hosted a small in-field peanut maturity clinic for 18 social media influencers to demonstrate one of the services provided by UGA Extension to help producers make optimal harvest timing decisions.

Collaborator's Role: In these educational efforts, the Georgia Peanut arranged attendee transportation, Commission invited attendees, coordinated media coverage of events, and funded the meetings and field days.

### 2022-2021 **Improving Over-Wintering Feeding Efficiency in Beef Cattle Operations**

Collaborated with the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service and **CAES** Department of Crop and Soil Science to conduct forage programming. To address cattle producer knowledge gaps in winter forage species, he established an on-farm demonstration in the fall of 2021. To extend the development of forage nutrition knowledge with beef cattlemen beyond this demonstration, he hosted a follow-up livestock production meeting. The meeting was promoted locally and was headlined by UGA Beef Cattle Nutritionist, Dr. Lawton Stewart. The meeting focused on improving livestock feed rations, the nutritional value of various forages, and how to interpret a hay sample report.

**Role:** Oversaw all aspects of the winter forage demonstration and concurrent educational programming. To establish the on-farm winter forage demonstration, he identified a willing farm collaborator, developed a forage plot plan, coordinated planting with the collaborating producer, and data collection for each treatment over the growing season. In planning the educational programming, he was responsible for fundraising for educational grower meetings, scheduling speakers, and event promotion.

Collaborator's Role: In this forage education effort, collaborators held numerous responsibilities to ensure project success. The primary collaborator duties included supplying seeds for each of the 7 winter forages included in the demonstration and facilitating other demonstrations across

the state of Georgia as part of a larger regional effort.

### 2021 Master Cattleman Program

The Master Cattlemen Program delivers a practical, research-based production management curriculum to beef cattle producers. This program educates producers about numerous aspects of cattle production including nutrition, facilities, forages, economics, marketing, animal diseases, herd health, external parasites, reproduction, Beef Quality Assurance, and sire selection. He hosted this 8-week program in a virtual format due to COVID-19 pandemic restrictions in collaboration with the **Georgia Cattleman's Association** and the Wilcox County ANR Extension program.

**Role:** Program promotion, speaker scheduling, managing attendee registration, moderating each weekly educational session, and coordinating Zoom access for all attendees.

**Collaborator's Role:** Serve as a program presenter, promote the program to association members, and educate program participants about Georgia Beef Cattle production and their role in supporting cattle producers.

### 2023 – 2019 **UGA Cotton Variety Trials**

Conducted cotton variety trials in Turner County, Georgia in collaboration with the UGA Department of Crop and Soil Science, UGA Department of Entomology, PhytoGen Cotton, Dyna-Gro Cotton, Deltapine Cotton, and Stoneville Cotton companies. and UGA Department of Crop and Soil Science collaborators. Conducting the UGA cotton variety trials is a statewide effort carried out by Extension agents, specialists, and farm collaborators across the state to help producers make a more informed decision when selecting an appropriate variety for their operation.

**Role:** Identify farmer collaborators, collect data on each variety over the growing season, oversee the planting and harvest of trials, and share trial results with local cotton growers.

**Collaborator's Role (PhytoGen Cotton, Dyna-Gro Cotton, Deltapine Cotton, and Stoneville Cotton):** Cotton companies provide seeds for modern varieties to be evaluated in the trials and continue to breed new varieties to improve cotton production and be evaluated.

**Collaborator's Role (UGA Department of Crop and Soil Science):** Provide technical assistance and necessary supplies needed to conduct the research as well as gin a small sample of seed cotton from each variety in the trial to estimate gin turnout and fiber quality for each variety evaluated.

### 2021 **2021 Spring Master Cattleman Program**

The Georgia Master Cattleman program is an eight-week collaborative beef cattle education effort between the University of Georgia and the Georgia Cattleman's Association. This course educates producers on best management practices and UGA recommendations in the areas of animal nutrition, herd health, forage planning strategies, beef industry economics, and parasite management among other topics. Participants also had the opportunity to obtain their Beef Quality Assurance certification through the program. The Georgia Master Cattleman program featured 11 speakers from 4 University of Georgia Departments and the Georgia Cattleman's Association. Each of the eight sessions lasted two hours with questions from the audience at the end of the presentations. Approximately 55 participants started the program and over 40 completed the program for certification as Master Cattleman. Program participants were from 27 Georgia counties and 1 South Carolina county.

## **Additional Outreach Programming**

These programs were conducted as continuing education programs to keep growers informed on the latest information, introduce them to new practices, agricultural policies, and technologies to help them produce a positive return on their commodities, and provide private and commercial pesticide hours/credits to satisfy their Georgia Department of Agriculture Pesticide license requirements. In each of these events hosted by Hancock, members were informed about program details through email, postcard-mailers, social media, and other public venues.
